

Dear Colonel Regner:

Subject: Toxic Drinking Water
Marine Corps Base-Camp Lejeune, N. C.

Dear Representative Pallone:

The purpose of this correspondence is to request your assistance in obtaining information regarding the toxic contamination of the drinking water system at Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune, North Carolina during the period of the 1970's.

My family and I were stationed at Camp Lejeune in 1975 and 1976. I served as an artillery officer with the 10th Marine Regiment, 2nd Marine Division. [REDACTED] Yesterday I received a telephone call from a friend who was stationed with me at Camp Lejeune and he stated that he received information from a governmental agency regarding a link and positive correlation between the contaminated water supply at Camp Lejeune from 1968 through the 1970's and cancer and/or birth defects. He gave me the following telephone number, 1-(800)639-4270, which I called this morning and only received a recording to leave my name/phone number.

I have always been very impressed with your anti-pollution initiatives and voting record regarding anti-pollution legislation. I am deeply dismayed with the prospect that my wife, children, and I were exposed to carcinogens or other volatile compounds while serving my country in the United States Marine Corps. [REDACTED]
