My family lived in MCB 3219 <sup>RDIV 5A</sup> ~~\_\_\_\_\_~~ in mid 1965 and later moved to MCB 2509 which we vacated in July 1967. The exact dates shall be available from the <sup>St. Mary's</sup> ~~\_\_\_\_\_~~ Base Housing Office.

During the years 1965, 1966, and 1967 where did the water granted to those noted MCBs originate? The data I have shows it could have come from the Holcomb Balawad facility or the Hackett Point facility or could be a blend of water pumped from both locations.

Given that the MCL figures for both facilities were incredibly high for TCE, DCE and PCE perhaps it doesn't matter; however, we would like to know what your records indicate for the years noted as to how the distribution system operated and where the blending process took place.
