Under the Freedom of Information Act, I am requesting the following information pertinent to the Camp Lejeune Water Survey.

The items requested are as follows:

- In regard to Site sixty-nine (69) the Chemical Dump at the Rifle Range.
  - A. My concern is not about the soil at this site, as it states in the Public Health Assessment (PHA) 1997 of Camp Lejeune. It's about the drums that were buried under the clean fill. What chemicals were or are still in the drums that are buried? After years of being there, what has happened to them due to natural corrosion of these drums? What other chemicals were deposited in this site? What is being done to the chemicals that have leached into the Aquifer?
  - B. What water distribution system distributed this water to the Rifle Range or was it also included in the base wide system.
  - C. I want to know, how much of site 69 contaminated the wells at the Rifle Range.
- The second area of data I am requesting from your office refers to the French Creek Barracks.
  - A. Any and all updated reports on this specific area called French Creek. Especially, those that have to do with the distribution of water in this region.
  - B. All updated reports on the contaminated wells in this region.


