

My name is Lionette Flewellin. My father, Joseph F. Gagne, Master Sergeant, was stationed at Camp Lejeune during the dates of the contamination, 1957-1962. We were on and off the base during this time...eating, drinking, medical care etc. My mother was pregnant during that time as well.

Dad had heart disease, diabetes and then died from cancer- the VA **did not diagnose** him properly or soon enough. He had cancer, starting in the prostate and progressing to the liver and pancreas. Mom had lymphoma, a sister had colon cancerous condition and 11 inches of her large intestine was removed. The brother who was born during this time has a very low IQ. He had gastroenteritis at age three and nearly died.

I developed fibromyalgia in 1961 and multiple sclerosis and was formally diagnosed in 1999.

These are the past and current medical conditions (highlighted above), in our family after the exposure. It is unclear how many of these conditions and/or illnesses could be a result of the contamination.
